"Captain Corelli's Mandolin" by Louis de Bernières,

Paul's Letter to the Corinthians 13:1-13

Note: You may choose to use part or all of I Corinthians 13. The most popular verses are 4-7, which begin "Love is patient, love is kind."

(1)If I speak with the tongues of men and of angels, but do not have love, I have become a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal.(2) If I have the gift of prophecy, and know all mysteries and all knowledge; and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do

not have love, I am nothing.

(3) And if I give all my possessions to feed the poor, and if I surrender my body to be burned, but do not have love, it profits me nothing.

(4) Love is patient, love is kind and is not jealous; love does not brag and is not arrogant,

(5) does not act unbecomingly; it does not seek its own, is not provoked, does not take into account a wrong suffered,

(6) does not rejoice in unrighteousness, but rejoices with the truth;

(7) bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.

(8) Love never fails; but if there are gifts of prophecy, they will be done away; if there are tongues, they will cease; if there is knowl-edge, it will be done away.

(9) For we know in part and we prophesy in part;

(10) but when the perfect comes, the partial will be done away.

(11) When I was a child, I used to speak like a child, think like a child, reason like a child; when I became a man, I did away with childish things.

(12) For now we see in a mirror dimly, but then face to face; now I know in part, but then I will know fully just as I also have been fully known.

(13) But now faith, hope, love, abide these three; but the greatest of these is love.
